GERM'S NOGICE

As per your enrolment contract, we require one full term's notice of withdrawal in writing to the Headmistress, in the event of a child being withdrawn from the school. If the requisite notice is not given, the parents or guardians will be liable to pay one term's fees in lieu of notice. You may give the school provisional notice until the move is confirmed to avoid being penalised.

ARRIVAL and COLLECTION

It is important that all children are at school on time in the morning. The bell rings at 7:25am: children should therefore arrive at school by no later than 7:35am. The gates will be closed at 7:40am. Any children arriving after this time will have to be accompanied by a parent to the school office or to their classroom.

All Grade 1s and 2s are to be collected at 12:35 (or by 1:05 at the very latest) from the verandah on the south side of the ħall. Grade 1 and 2 pupils will <u>NOG</u> be allowed to stay and wait for an older sibling to finish sport. If you organize for someone else to fetch your child, please send written authorization or call the office to inform us of whom is collecting your child. When collecting or taking your child to the classroom please <u>DO NOG WALK</u> <u>GħROUGħ GħE SGAFF CAR PARK</u>: either walk on the paths or the field. No parents are to wait in the Infant Quad area or in front of the Grade 4 classrooms.

DRESS CODE

Girls - Grey skirt, white shirt with school logo, short white socks, black shoes and turquoise hat.

Boys - Grey shorts, white shirt with school logo, school tie, long grey socks, black shoes and turquoise hat.

Everything must be marked and labelled with your child's full name – including underwear, socks and shoes.

Please note that children are not to leave the school premises barefoot; they may wear slops after swimming. We expect our children to look smart in their uniform at all times, especially on shopping trips with mum or dad.
